

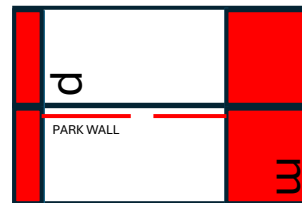
“The Den Brink Gate”



Oosterbeek— September 19th 1944

On the 19th of September, elements of the British 2 Staffords C Coy under Major Robert Cain, were attempting to retake control of the Den Brink Park in Oosterbeek. The focus of their effort would be directed towards control and defense of the Den Brink Gate which was accessed by Alexderstraat. SS-Bataillon Bartholomai was moving armor and Panzergrenadiers to seize the gate and push the British out of the park.

VICTORY CONDITIONS: The German Player wins at game end if there are no Good Order British MMC's on or adjacent to the H5-H3-O3 Road.



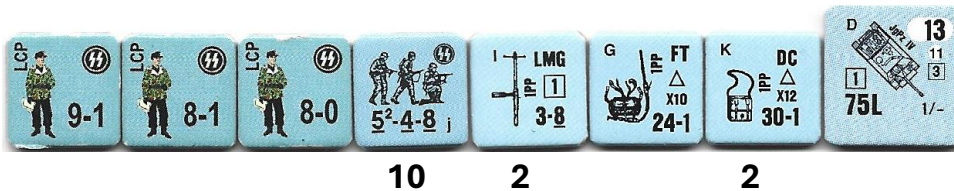
Board Configuration:

DASL Boards d & m (Only Rows A-I are playable on Board d and Rows G-O on Board m)

Special Rules/Notes:

- EC are Moderate with no Wind at start. Bore Sighting (C6.4) and Kindling (B25.11) are N.A
- Hex H5/H5 represents the Entrance Gate to the Den Brink Park which constitutes DASL Board m. The gate is open, but as a result of the gate structure Vehicular Bypass (D2.3) is NA for this Hex.
- A Level One Brick Wall exits in in the dividing line of Board d & m. The wall may be Breached (23.9221) and/or Scaled (B23.424), but otherwise cannot be passed through except through the gate in H5/H5.
- An Orchard Road Hex exists in Hex DASL mH4.
- The British Player may not declare a Gun Duel (C2.2401 / C5.33). The British AT Gun is under Low Ammo (D3.71).



Aftermath: Constrained by the high park brick wall, the German attack was necessarily forced to move directly through the Den Brink Gate, which was directly in the line of sight of Major Cain's troops and single 6lb AT Gun. The SS Panzergrenadiers advanced behind a Jagdpanzer IV and a supporting flamethrower. As the Jagdpanzer moved through the gate, it directly confronted the 6lb AT Gun. The British gunners were a second too slow and were eliminated by the Jagdpanzer. With his AT support eliminated, Major Cain fought a stiff, but brief firefight against the advancing SS Panzergrenadiers. Major Cain and his surviving Staffords would relocate to new positions in the south of Oosterbeek.
